
SEALING your safe room to prevent CHEMICAL VAPORS from entering your home –

The very act of trying to protect your children may very well expose them to the dangers that the **SHELTER IN PLACE** is protecting them from.

The Lac du Bonnet schools have drills in place that will keep your children safe.

Call the School

DO NOT GO TO THE SCHOOL and attempt to pick up your children while the situation remains a threat.

Connect By all-net Communication Automation

The **CONNECT** notification system is a service provided by the RM and Town of Lac du Bonnet to share information with residents.

Once you have registered for the notifications, you will receive:

- Non-emergency information like road closures, updated landfill hours and important municipal issues;
- EMERGENCY information like FIRE BANS, EVACUATIONS and events that could impact the safety and security residents or cause damage to personal property.

The system makes notifications by phone, cell phone, text message and email messages.

Why would you be asked to Shelter in Place?

Chemicals are an everyday part of life on the prairies and in the event of an accident causing chemical leakage, Fire Officials may want you to go into our house, stay there and seal the windows and doors so that chemical vapors will not get into your homes and contaminate the air that you breath.

Or. . .

There could be a potentially violent situation happening near your home and the Police may want you to stay in your home and keep away from windows to be safe.

Shelter in Place Kit



- ✓ 2-4 mil poly pre-cut for doors and any windows in safe room
- tape
- ✓ battery-powered radio
- ✓ flashlight
- ✓ phone or cell phone
- a towel to seal the bottom of the door
- ✓ some non-perishable food items and drinking water
 - most shelter in place events are very short in duration

Follow these steps when instructed to **Shelter in Place:**

- 1. Move people and pets indoors immediately;
- Close and lock all windows and doors;
- Move everyone to a
 pre-selected room in the
 basement or a room with
 no outside doors and
 windows;
- Cover any doors and windows with plastic and tape;
- 5. Listen to CJOB or monitor FACEBOOK – Lac du Bonnet Emergency Management for information updates.
