#### **RURAL MUNICIPALITY OF LAC DU BONNET**

# TRAVEL TRAILER BY-LAW No. 03-22 - Amendment

**BEING** a by-law of the Rural Municipality of Lac du Bonnet to provide for the regulation of seasonal long-term occupancy and parking of travel trailers on a private property with a dwelling within the boundaries of the Rural Municipality of Lac du Bonnet, and to amend by-law 03-22.

WHEREAS Section 232(1) of The Municipal Act provides as follows:

232(1) A council may pass by-laws for the municipal purposes respecting the following matters

- c) subject to section 233, activities or thing in or on private property.
- o) the enforcement of by-laws

AND WHEREAS Section 233 of the Municipal Act provides as follows:

- A by-law under clause 232(1)(c) activities or things in or on private property may contain provisions only in respect of
  - a) The requirement that land and improvements be kept and maintained in a safe and clean condition;
  - b) The parking and storing of vehicles, including the number and type of vehicles that may be kept or stored and the manner of parking and storing;
  - c) The removal of top soil; and
  - d) Activities or things that in the opinion of the council are or could become a nuisance, which may include noise, weeds, odors, unsightly property, fumes and vibrations.

AND WHEREAS Section 236 of the Municipal Act provides as follows:

- 236(1) Without limiting the generality of clause 232(1)(o) enforcement of by-laws, a by-law passed under that clause may include provisions
  - a) Providing for procedures, including inspections, for determining whether by-laws are being complied with; and
  - b) Remedying contraventions of by-laws, including:
    - i. Creating offences,
    - ii. Subject to the regulations, providing for fines and penalties, including the imposition of a penalty for an offence that is in addition to a fine or imprisonment, so long as the penalty related to a fee, rate, toll, charge, or cost that is associated with the conduct that gives rise to the offence, or related to enforcing the by-law,
    - iii. Providing that an amount owing under subclause (ii) may be collected in any manner in which a tax may be collected or enforced under this Act,
    - iv. Seizing, removing, impounding, confiscating, and selling or otherwise disposing of plants, animals, vehicles, or other things related to a contravention,
    - v. Charging and collecting costs incurred in respect of acting under subclause
    - vi. Imposing a sentence of imprisonment for not more than six months for the commission of offences or nonpayment of fines

**AND WHEREAS** the Rural Municipality of Lac du Bonnet's *Enforcement By-Law* provides for the enforcement of any violations or contraventions of this by-law;

**AND WHEREAS** it is deemed necessary and desirable to regulate the seasonal long-term occupancy and parking of travel trailers on private property with a dwelling within the Rural Municipality of Lac du Bonnet:

**NOW THEREFORE** the Council of the Rural Municipality of Lac du Bonnet in Council duly assembled, enacts as follows:

TRAVEL TRAILER BY-LAW 03-21

#### 1. DEFINITIONS:

- a) "Towing Company" means any person, firm or corporation who carries on the business of towing away illegally or improperly parked vehicles.
- b) "Designated officer" means the person or persons designated by the municipality as responsible for the enforcement of its by-laws.
- c) "Municipality" means the Rural Municipality of Lac du Bonnet.
- d) "Park" means to stand a vehicle whether occupied or not.
- e) "Stand", as applied to a vehicle, whether occupied or not, means
  - i) when required, to cause the vehicle to remain motionless in one place, and;
  - ii) when prohibited, to cause the vehicle to remain motionless in one place, except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with the directions of a peace officer or a traffic control device
- f) "Travel Trailer" (including motor homes, tent trailers and similar recreational vehicles) means a self-propelled vehicle or vehicles without a motive power, designed to be drawn by a motor vehicle, used as a transient living accommodation facility for travel, recreation, business, trade, vacation and construction work, and designed for frequent moves.

#### 2. APPLICATION

This By-Law applies to owners, tenants, and occupants of the property within the Rural Municipality of Lac du Bonnet.

#### 3. PROVISIONS

- a) No person may park a travel trailer on a vacant lot unless;
  - i) The property owner has an active building permit and temporary trailer permit.
- b) No person may park and occupy more than two travel trailers on their property with a dwelling except:
  - i) If the travel trailer(s) are parked on a property with a dwelling on a short-term basis for not more than a weekend, or a long weekend, or
  - ii) If the property is an approved Trailer Park and/or campground.
- c) Long term seasonal parking of travel trailers on a property with a dwelling may only be occupied on a seasonal basis from May 1<sup>st</sup> to October long weekend.
- d) Long term seasonal parking of trailer trailers on a property with a dwelling must be connected to a septic or holding tank that is consistent with Provincial environmental regulations for sewage disposal except:
  - i) If the travel trailer(s) are parked on the property with a dwelling on a short-term basis for not more than a weekend, or a long weekend, and;
  - ii) If the travel trailer is being stored on the property and is not being occupied by any person.

#### 4. PERMIT APPLICATION

- a) Property owners must receive approval from the Rural Municipality of Lac du Bonnet authorizing long term occupancy of one (1) or two (2) travel trailers between May 1<sup>st</sup> and October long weekend, in accordance with Section 3 of this By-Law.
- b) Property owners must submit a permit application to the CAO, attached as Schedule "A."
- c) Upon receiving the permit application, the CAO will review and then advise the applicant if the permit application was approved.
- d) Upon approval of the permit application, the applicant must pay any applicable permit fees in full. The municipality will then provide the applicant with a permit, and they must display the permit in a prominent location on the travel trailer(s).
- e) All permits will expire on the Monday of October Long Weekend at 11:59 p.m.

- f) Upon expiration of the permit, the property owners must remove the travel trailers unless:
  - 1. The travel trailer is registered for use pursuant to the Highway Traffic Act, or
  - 2. The travel trailer has, within the preceding thirty days been registered for use pursuant to the Highway Traffic Act, or
  - 3. The travel trailer is wholly contained within a lawfully existing structure on the property, or
  - 4. The travel trailer is parked or stored in close proximity of any dwelling so as to be in a tidy, well-maintained manner.
- g) A permit is not required for travel trailers that are being **stored** on a property with a dwelling if:
  - 1. The travel trailer is registered for use pursuant to the Highway Traffic Act, or
  - 2. The travel trailer has, within the preceding thirty days been registered for use pursuant to the Highway Traffic Act, or
  - 3. The travel trailer is wholly contained within a lawfully existing structure on the property, or
  - 4. The travel trailer is parked or stored in close proximity of any dwelling so as to be in a tidy, well-maintained manner.

#### 5. ENFORCEMENT, NOTICE OF VIOLATION, ORDER TO REMEDY AND APPEAL

- a) Any person who contravenes a provision of this by-law is subject to enforcement by the Municipality through the Municipal Act and/or the Municipalities Enforcement By-Law.
- b) Notices of Violation and Orders shall be issued in accordance with the Municipalities Enforcement By-Law. (Attached as Schedule B and Schedule C)
- c) Any person who receives an Order to Remedy shall follow the Appeal process in accordance with the Enforcement By-Law. (Attached as Schedule D)

#### 6. REMEDYING THE CONTRAVENTION

- a) The Municipality may take whatever action or measures necessary to remedy a contravention of this by-law, the Municipal Act, or any other Act that the Municipality is authorized to enforce, or to prevent, and to prevent a re-occurrence of the contravention.
- b) The Designated Officer may remedy the contravention in accordance the Municipalities Enforcement By-Law.

### 7. REMOVAL OF THE TRAVEL TRAILER

Pursuant to Section 6, the Designated Officer may authorize any travel trailer parked in contravention of this By-Law be towed, impounded and stored by the Municipality, or an authorized Towing Company.

### 8. REDEMPTION OF A TRAVEL TRAILER

- a) A travel trailer removed from a contravention of this by-law, shall be released to the owner of the travel trailer upon full payment of all costs, penalties and/or fines in accordance with the Municipalities Enforcement By-Law.
- b) Costs associated with the removal of the vehicle include, but are not limited to, the towing, impoundment, storage, and/or destruction and disposal of the travel trailer.

#### 9. PENALTIES AND CHARGES

- a) The costs (including legal fees related to the enforcement) of an action or measure taken by the Municipality under this by-law are an amount owing to the Municipality by the Person who contravened the by-law in accordance with the Municipalities Enforcement By-Law.
- b) In addition, such costs, penalties and charges pursuant to this By-Law are a debt owing the Municipality and may be collected in the same manner as a tax may be collected or enforced under the Municipal Act.

#### 10. COMING INTO FORCE

a) This By-Law comes into force on the day of passage.
